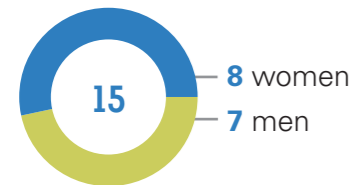
IO-2 Better Balance in Leadership

*A sample of 72 clients was reassessed in 2020 – 91% are women

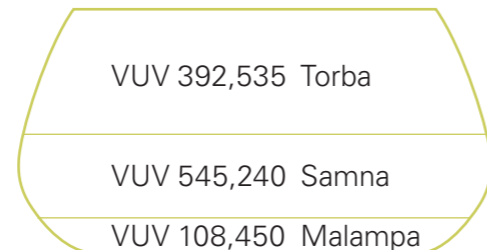
IO-3 Co-investment

Of the Department of Industry's 2019 co-contribution, **VUV 296,347** is remaining

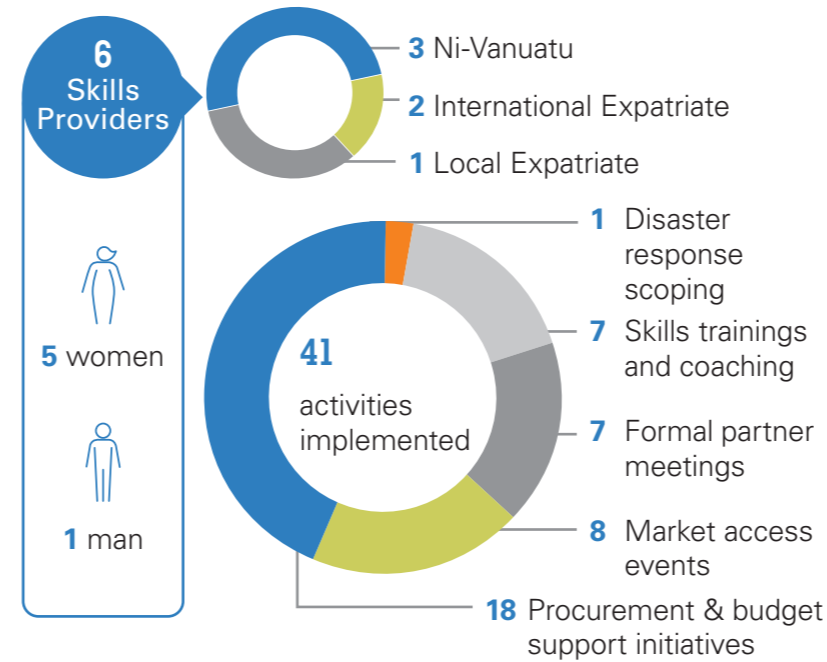
Department of Industry Indirect Co-contribution **VUV 2,142,450**

2 clients with disabilities represented provincial artisans at sales events in Port Vila

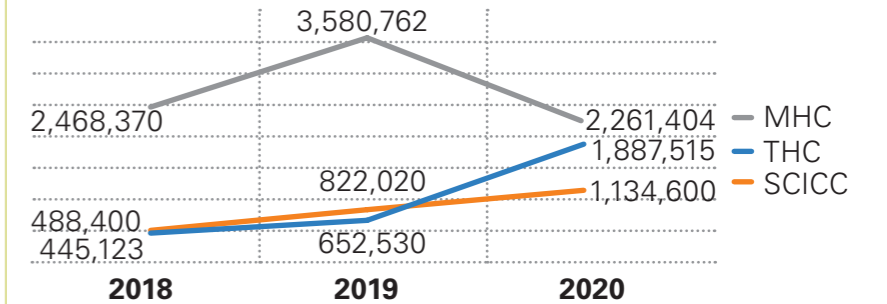
