## **Enhancing lives and livelihoods**

## Skills for Agribusiness - Food Security

**Name of activity:** Site visit for Kamewa school meal improvement Standard facility design and Aore Adventist Academic Boarding School Farming initiatives (Farm to School).

Location: Kamewa School and Aore Adventist Academic.

Total number of participants: (disaggregated by gender and disability)

Two principals = 2 men

#### Overview:

The visit by two officials from the VSP is an initiative to support boarding schools such as AAA to better manage their boarding fees by investing on agriculture in order to feed their students with local and healthy food crops instead of investing on imported food. Subsequently, the project will address the importance of food security.

To utilize available space of farming land of the school and establish a multiplication plot farm inline of the concept of one stop shop (integrated or sequential cropping method) of local variety of food crops, legumes and vegetables to enrich the healthy diets of the students.















## Key achievements/ outcomes:

- ➤ VSP will assist the school to grow and produce food crops, legumes and vegetables by using an allocated land space.
- At the harvest stage of the grown garden VSP will train the chief cook to develop local and healthy recipe using the grown garden of food crops, legumes and vegetables to prepare meals in the school kitchen for student consumption.
- ➤ Cost of the visit VSP met the cost of the visit that lasted from travelling across the waters from Saint Michelle at 9:30am and returned at 12:30noon on Friday, 12th February 2021.
- Work plan for implementation, design (SfC) infrastructure to support initiative,
- draft design in development for kitchen

#### Skills for Creative Industries

Name of activity: Professional Development Workshop for SCICC, MHC and THC Managers

Location: Luganville

**Total number of participants: (disaggregated by gender and disability)** 4 men, 4 women.

#### Overview:

A three-day workshop was held in the Sanma Skills Centre aimed at empowering handicraft hub managers from Malampa Handicraft Centre (MHC), Torba Handicraft Cooperative (THC) and Sanma Creative Industries Community Company (SCICC). It was an opportunity for these women to meet each other and exchange experiences of how their different business models and standard operating procedure work, to share challenges and explore solutions. It was also a chance to think about how they might work collaboratively to mutual benefit.

Key achievements/ outcomes:















- A very strong presence from Vanuatu Intellectual Property Office (VIPO) with 3 senior members delivering informative and encouraging presentations added to the sense of recognition and value of the handicraft sector.
- The Department of Industry showed its commitment to this sector and participants see a real connection to the VSP partnership.
- Hub Managers enjoyed meeting and discussing ideas and plans to support one another within the VSP organisation. For example, how to share expenses at future sales events, exchanging experiences on what has and hasn't worked, and how to manage different management and operational issues.
- The VSP vision and updated plans for Creative Industries gave participants are clear insight into the current situation and enables them to plan accordingly.

Name of activity: Graduation of Cert II Plumbing Trainees

#### Overview:

Another milestone for skills training in Sanma and for Vanuatu was reached 5th February when 14 plumbers in SANMA province walked down the aisle to collect a nationally and internationally recognised qualification, after successfully completing all 20 units of the new Certificate II in Plumbing training package.

### Key achievements/ outcomes:

This marks the first ever local delivery of the Certificate II in Plumbing in Vanuatu, thanks to the joint effort between Torgil Rural Training Centre (under the Anglican Church of Melanesia Vocational Education and Training School — ACOMVETS), the Vanuatu Skills Partnership (VSP) through the Sanma Skills Centre under the Ministry of Education and Training (MoET), and the Australia Pacific Training Coalition (APTC).

## **Provincial Government Leadership & Management**

Name of activity: Joint West Coast Scoping Visit

**Location: North West Coast Santo** 















Total number of participants: (disaggregated by gender and disability) 4 men, 4 women.

#### Overview:

For the first time a joint VSP, DARD, DOI Scoping trip was held in collaboration with the Sanma Provincial Government's Area Councils. Proposed priority for 2021 in Sanma is to strengthen service delivery through the Area Council Network- most activities in 2021 will be run in partnership with Area Administrator to strengthen decentralised approach for Government of Vanuatu.

## Key achievements/ outcomes:

- Scoping with Area Councils have identified:
  - Demand for establishment of bee keeping project- 15-20 farmers in each community (10-15 in each Area Council) – utilise budget from sectors as well as Area Councils.
  - Collaboration with Sunset Environment Network in West Santo to support
    Pandanus Replanting (Doctor Chris + Dept of Forestry) to partner on this initiative
    in the Eden Hope area. Discussions to confirm link value chain- sustainable supply
    of pandanus from the area to SCICC.
  - O Support Department of Industry and Department of Agriculture with Vanuatu National export Development program for Taro Export in Northwest and South Santo. Training component concept will be developed to support this program.
