A more inclusive, quality assured and increasingly decentralised skills system

82 skills development activities

including 13 accredited trainings, on 14 islands across 6 provinces through the provincial Skills Centres in remote locations such as Northwest Santo, Torres, Merelava, Aneityum and Emae.

3 registered training providers

engaged through the provincial Skills Centres to deliver accredited courses in remote locations (off-campus).

8 registered training providers

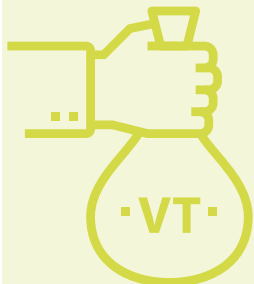
supported towards meeting quality requirements for registration by the Vanuatu Qualifications Authority.

LONG TERM OUTCOME 2

Developmental leadership drives collective action for improved service delivery

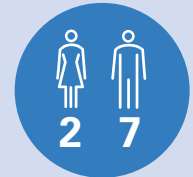
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provincial Secretary Generals acknowledged the Partnership as a major contributing factor in their respective province's progress towards the goals of the National Sustainable Development Plan at the National Summit in June.

Over 2,000 students and community members

in Tanna, Santo and Pentecost now have improved access to safe, clean water and sanitation facilities through collaboration brokered by the Partnership between national, provincial and community stakeholders.

from government, training providers, and civil society supported to undertake a Certificate IV Leadership and Management course through the APTC.

Critical contributions to post-cyclone response coordination after 3 Tropical Cyclones caused significant damage in 4 provinces, including participation in 3 national sector response clusters.

co-facilitated for provincial and national government staff in partnership with Balance of Power.

1 new Area Council building was constructed in NW Santo,

through an 'on-the-job' training practicum bringing government services closer to the people in this remote location.

Successful development and pilot of a new digital community profiling tool in **all 11 Area Councils of Sanma Province.**

LONG TERM OUTCOME 3

Sustainable benefits (economic, environmental, and cultural) for Partnership clients and their communities

Skills and employment pathways

40 plumbers and construction graduates

contracted to support community infrastructure initiatives in Santo, Ambae, Pentecost and Gaua.

4 new businesses established

in Santo and Malekula by 60 trade graduates (8 women, 52 men including 2 men with disabilities) after the completion of accredited training in construction and plumbing in 2022 and 2023.

19 plumbing trainees from Pentecost

currently undertaking Certificate II in Plumbing contracted to support the WASH Cluster post TC Lola to conduct rapid assessments and provide urgent repairs in three Area Councils on Pentecost.

including 642 women (50%) and 37 participants with disabilities (3%), accessed skills training facilitated by provincial Skills Centres.

Income and market access

83%

of Skills Centre clients surveyed¹ stated that Partnership support has been 'very important' or 'important' for their income generation in the past 12 months.

40%

of Skills Centre clients surveyed¹ reported increased income this year compared to last year.

Creative Industries hubs in Torba and Sanma province have **more than doubled their sales from 2022 to 2023** due to expanding market opportunities facilitated by the Partnership.

216 high value products from Malampa, Torba and Ambae clients showcased at an exhibition at the Auckland Museum with initial sales generating



a revenue of 752,910 VUV

and an ongoing market access outlet established.

In October, the Sanma creative industry hub exported **300 hats** to Hill Hats in New Zealand.

22 beekeeper clients

in remote Northwest Vanuatu have made over VUV550,000 in sales in three months.

39 pepper farming clients

on Malo have established three new business associations.

In 2023 combined sales of VUV 9.5 million

were recorded across the creative industries hubs supporting over 320 producers in Torba, Malampa, Sanma and Tafea provinces.

Food security

20 farmers



in East Vanua Lava coached on alley cropping techniques to strengthen food security.

Collaboration with the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development for the establishment of a National Seedbank, including recruitment and ongoing training of **18 seedbank officers across all provinces.**

12 school cooks



in Penama province trained in recipe development using local produce, waste management and value adding techniques.

Inclusion

642 women participated in skills activities representing 50% of total participants compared to 40% in 2022.

45 women participated in accredited training courses through the provincial Skills Centres in 2023, representing 19% of all trainees.

Of these 40% completed courses in non-traditional trade areas.

37 people with disabilities participated in skills activities, representing 3% of all participants.

9 female leaders were supported to participate in international networking events in Fiji, New Zealand and Australia.

The Vanuatu Society for

People with Disability was supported to design and undertake rapid situation assessments for people with a disability following TCs Judy and Kevin.

women were appointed as Directors of the Board of the creative industries hub in Tafea.

houses were rebuilt for people with disabilities on Tanna by a local Skills Centre graduate carpenter who is deaf, as part of ongoing TC Judy/Kevin recovery efforts.
