Chiefs' Nakamal reconstructed and officially reopened on Chiefs' Day 2025 through a collaboration between the Vanuatu Skills Partnership, the Malvatumauri Council of Chiefs, Vanuatu Institute of Technology and the Australia Pacific Training Coalition.

Income and Market Access

Tafea Creative Industry and Cultural Market Hub products showcased and sold in an internationally renowned 'Diva' exhibition in Auckland, New Zealand.

Market Readiness surveys in Sanma, Malekula and Tanna conducted with owners of 61 provincial tourism businesses in partnership with the VTO.

The Vanuatu Travel Information Centre - Malekula branch, constructed by Malampa Skills Centre clients, was officially opened in May 2025.
